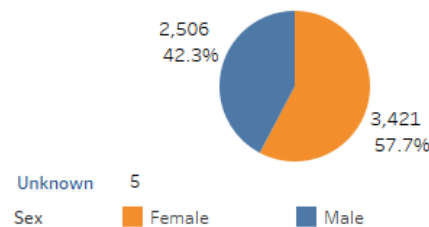

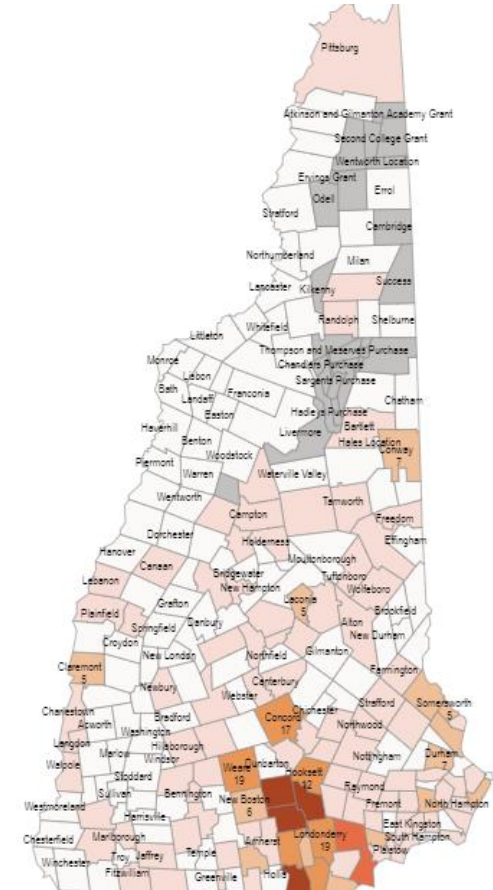
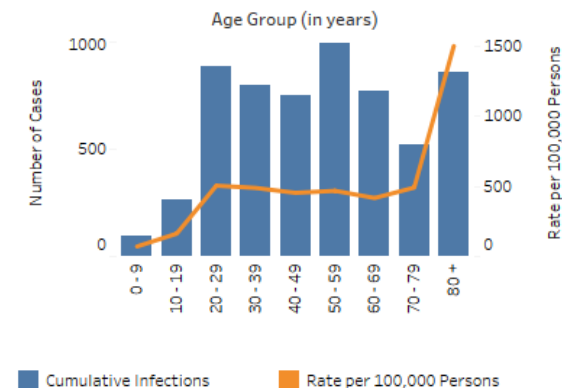
COVID-19 CASES BY SEX

Quarantine Questions:

Who Needs To Quarantine ?

- Children or staff with any COVID-19 symptoms,
 - Fever
 - Respiratory symptoms such as runny nose, sore throat, cough, or shortness of breath
 - Flu-like symptoms such as muscle aches, chills, and severe fatigue
 - Changes in a person's sense of taste or smell
- Children or staff who report close contact with someone suspected or confirmed with COVID-19,
- Children or staff reporting travel risk.

Quarantine Questions:

How long?

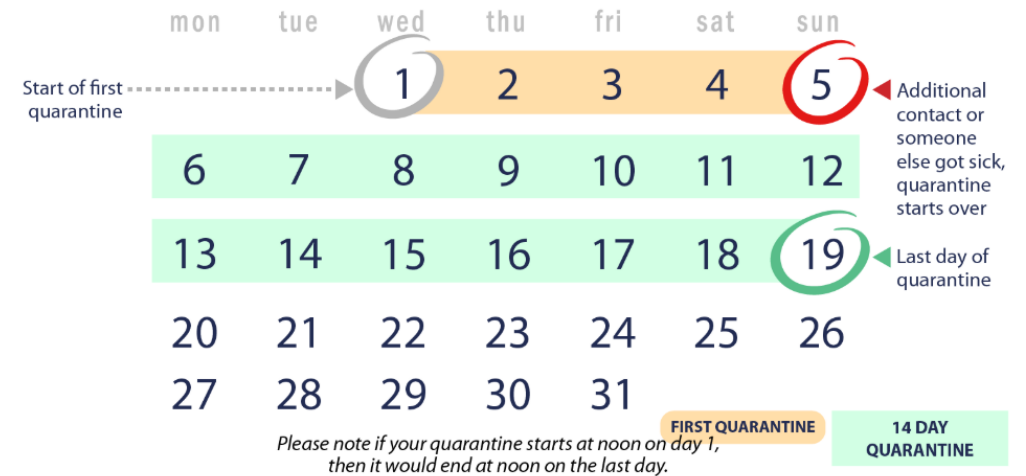
CLOSE CONTACT WITH SOMEONE WHO HAS COVID-19—
WILL NOT HAVE FURTHER CLOSE CONTACT

Date of last close contact with person who has COVID-19 + 14 days = end of quarantine



UNDER **QUARANTINE** AND HAD **ADDITIONAL**
CLOSE CONTACT WITH SOMEONE WHO HAS COVID-19

Date of additional close contact with person who has COVID-19 + 14 days = end of quarantine



Quarantine Questions: *Travel*

Traveled in the past 14 days either:

- Internationally (outside the U.S.),
- By cruise ship, or
- Domestically (within the U.S.) outside of NH, VT, or ME **on public transportation** (e.g., bus, train, plane, etc.).

Travel in Private Vehicles is Permissible.



Group Size and Outdoor Play

Maintain Small Cohorts

- Child care programs should, ***whenever possible***, reduce group sizes to no more than 10 people total, including children and adults
- Small cohorts reduce the number of staff and children impacted if there is an exposure.
 - Fewer people exposed = fewer people who potentially need to quarantine

Spend time outdoors

- Water play with sprinklers, spray bottles, etc. is OK!
 - ***Just limit shared toys***
 - ***Stay in your small cohorts***
- High touch surfaces made of plastic or metal, such as grab bars and railings should be cleaned ***routinely***
 - ***Playgrounds just need routine, normal cleaning***
 - ***Follow all directions on cleaning and disinfectant products***

CARES Act Child Care Recovery and Stabilization Program (CCRSP) Update

- **420 applicants** (representing 598 programs) **notified** about CCRSP award status
- **570 applicants (95%) received award letters.** Remainder must complete their applications – including full financial documents
- **Video of agreement & attestation process** available on CCAoNH website; to be emailed to all CCRSP awardees
- **\$14,911,400* in Round 1 funds awarded** to 570 programs
- **\$520,000 pending for 28 programs** missing documents/needing further review
- **Range:** \$1600 - more than \$1 million

* Subject to change as adjustments made for N of children

- My award was much smaller than I expected. It won't even cover rent.
