Child Care Aware of New Hampshire, a program of Southern New Hampshire Services, is pleased to provide this full-day conference devoted to quality professional development to assist child care programs, early childhood professionals and administrators in enhancing and improving their practices.

Participants will partake in the **Keynote Presentation: I Can't Self-Care My Way Out of This: Addressing Chronic Stress in the Workplace,** with Cassie Gillespie, LICSW. Participants will then have the opportunity to select from **three (3) additional sessions** with a wide range of topics to choose from.

A total of twenty-four (24) training opportunities will be offered and each one will be categorized for those wishing to take a "Training Track" specific to one (1) area of focus. Cassie is a former child welfare worker, and training team lead at the Vermont Child Welfare Training Partnership (VT-CWTP). Chronic stress and secondary trauma exposure in the workplace are big problems that can lead to burnout, low morale, poor health, staff turnover, and diminished outcomes for your clients. All too often organizations do not address chronic stress, or only address it through the lens of self-care. In this presentation, Cassie will offer an alternate frame for thinking about chronic stress (and what we can do about it) in the workplace.




